

TOWN OF SPRINGVILLE

***** PLEASE READ *****

1. Town Board meets the 4th Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m.
2. Meeting notices are posted at the following locations:
 - Adams County Times
 - Corner of 11th Ave & Fern Ave
 - Theisen's Lumber Yard (State Hwy 13)
3. Springville is zoned. Permits are required prior to building. This includes the moving of any mobile homes or other structure onto your property. Always check with the Adams County Zoning Administrator.
4. Before making a driveway, check with a Town Supervisor. You may be required to install a culvert or build up the driveway to the road surface. Any damage cause to the road from an improperly installed driveway is the responsibility of the landowner. In the Spring of 2007 driveways that have not met these requirement will be brought up to standard by the Town and billed to the landowner. **Driveways must have a minimum width of 12 feet to allow access of emergency vehicles.**
5. Fire signs must be maintained by the landowner. These signs are for your safety! If the sign is not seen, an ambulance or fire truck may not be able to find your location in time! If you need a sign or a replacement, contact the Land Information Office at (608) 339-4525.
6. Pushing of snow or other materials on or across roadways I prohibited by State Law. Damage to mailboxes caused by snow plowing or other right-of-way maintenance if done by the Town or County, contact the party responsible for repair or replacement.
7. Burning permits are required unless there is adequate snow cover. **Time of burning is from 6:00 p.m. until midnight. Burning is not allowed on Sundays or Holidays.** Unattended fires are prohibited. You will be responsible for and damage caused by your fire. Town Ordinance require that a minimum fee of \$500.00 be charged for fire suppression.
8. Town right-of-way on roads is from centerline to 33 feet back on either side. This right-of-way must be kept clear of trees, stumps, fences and other obstructions.
9. Reflectors of driveways and mailboxes are to be blue only. This method of marking is a State law. The use of amber or reed is limited to vehicles.
10. Adams County has a leash law and it is enforced. If you have dogs, they must be under control in a fenced-in area or a pen or on a leash at all times. Dogs running loose can cost the owner a substantial fine. Also, all dogs are required to have a license.
